Life cycle

When they are about 3 months old they will be able to fly and help get their own food. A scarlet macaw will remain with their parents for up to 1 year. A family seems very important to a scarlet macaw. Female scarlet macaws lay about 1 to 4 eggs in their nest. Scarlet macaws sit and incubate them for 3 to 4 weeks until they hatch. Also scarlet macaws live very long. Scarlet Macaws live to be between 40 and 50 years old in the wild. In captivity, they will live to be about 75 years old. This might stop them from living long. The scarlet macaw's predators are large cats, eagles, and hawks. Some adult scarlet macaws can escape their predators. There are many ways of life for a scarlet macaw.
